

## **Dogs A.C.T Agility Dog of the Year.**

### **Entry:**

Competition results from ANKC Agility trials conducted in the ACT, by affiliated clubs, from the 1st trial in September each year up to and including the last trial in August the year following will be used to determine entrants to the Dogs A.C.T Agility Dog of the Year competition.

The top five (5) qualifying Trial results per dog from Agility classes (AD, ADX, ADM & ADO) will be counted.

Placings of qualifying results will be determined across all heights as one class (not separate heights) for each eligible trial. Scoring of the qualifying results will be 'Normalised' by awarding 10 points to 1st, 9 points to 2<sup>nd</sup>, 8 to 3rd etc. to a minimum of 1 point for 10<sup>th</sup> place or lower. Therefore five (5) 1st places will achieve a score of fifty (50) points. All classes will be scored the same.

The top twenty (20) (or more if equal scores exist) scoring dogs, as determined by Dogs A.C.T. will be invited to compete in a suitable event to contest for the ACTCA Agility Dog of the Year. Competitors must be members of an ANKC affiliated body.

### **The Event Competition:**

The event will be conducted in conjunction with the Dogs ACT State Agility Titles, normally held in September or October each year.

The event will be an Agility course based on Excellent standard challenges with 12 weave poles but without the seesaw and will consist of up to 24 obstacles.

The course will be designed under the control of the Dogs A.C.T. Agility Sub-Committee.

### **Prize:**

The winner will receive a trophy and ribbon and will be named Dogs A.C.T. Agility Dog of the Year.

## **Dogs A.C.T Jumping Dog of the Year.**

### **Entry:**

Competition results from ANKC Agility trials conducted in the ACT, by affiliated clubs, from the 1st trial in September each year up to and including the last trial in August the year following will be used to determine entrants to the Dogs A.C.T. Jumping Dog of the Year competition.

The top five (5) qualifying Trial results per dog from Jumping classes (JD, JDX, JDM & JDO) will be counted.

Placings of qualifying results will be determined across all heights as one class (not separate heights) for each eligible trial. Scoring of the qualifying results will be 'Normalised' by awarding 10 point to 1st, 9 points to 2<sup>nd</sup>, 8 to 3rd etc. to a minimum of 1 point for 10<sup>th</sup> place or lower. Therefore five (5) 1st places will achieve a score of fifty (50) points. All classes will be scored the same.

The top twenty (20) (or more if equal scores exist) scoring dogs, as determined by Dogs A.C.T. will be invited to compete in a suitable event to contest for the Dogs A.C.T. Jumping Dog of the Year. Competitors must be members of an ANKC affiliated body.

### **The Event Competition:**

The event will be conducted in conjunction with the Dogs ACT State Agility Titles, normally held in September or October each year.

The event will be a Jumping course based on Excellent standard challenges without weave poles and will consist of up to 24 obstacles.

The course will be designed under the control of the Dogs A.C.T. Agility Sub-Committee.

### **Prize:**

The winner will receive a trophy and ribbon and will be named Dogs A.C.T. Jumping Dog of the Year.
