- Entry will only be available through the K9Entries online entries system - no paper entries, cash or cheques will be accepted.
- Total numbers of persons on the grounds shall not exceed the ACT Government Guidelines - <https://www.covid19.act.gov.au/what-you-can-do> at the time of the trial.
- There shall be no paper catalogues issued at this event.
- Catalogue will be available through K9 Entries, and Facebook Group "ACT Agility".
- There shall be NO setting up of any exhibitor equipment prior to 3.00 pm on the day of the trial.
- Handlers must vacate the Grounds within 30 minutes of being completing their event/s, or after receiving any qualification cards.

COURSE WALKING

- Course walk throughs will be divided appropriately, and announced before course walking begins on the day

QUALIFICATION CARDS

- Qualification Cards will be available within the Club House at the Grounds, laid out on a table with a place sash if award 1st, 2nd or 3rd
- ACT Companion Dog Clubs offers Title Sashes for any competitor who gains a title. Please speak to the Trial Manager if you wish to receive a title sash. There is no extra fee for this sash.

TEMPORARY CHANGE TO ANKC AGILITY RULE REGARDING LEADS AND COLLARS

Current Rule:

7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. The lead and harness or head collar must be removed, the collar may be removed and all items handed to a Steward.

The temporary modified Rule:

'7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. **The lead will be removed, the collar maybe removed. The Handler will either place the lead/collar in a pocket whilst running the course or wear it on them (e.g. clipped around their waist like a belt). If any of these items fall to the ground or the dog grabs the lead while running the course this will result in a DQ. The lead/collar must be inaudible and if not this will result in a DQ.'**
