Dogs ACT has bought a *defibrillator*. Many thanks to those Clubs and members who have donated funds to purchase it. The box within which it is held is kept just inside the meeting room door to your right, next to the first aid kit box.

If you need it do not be concerned as the defibrillator has voice commands to tell you what to do should someone on the grounds be suffering from a heart attack. Of course, your immediate reaction should be to contact '000' for an ambulance but the defibrillator can be used in the meantime.

FCI News – The FCI Executive Director, Y de Clerq, sent a letter to Australia indicating that due to the sanitary situation (Covid-19) they had cancelled the 2020 FCI European Section Dog Show due to be held in Slovenia due to be held in October 2020, postponed to May 2021 had been definitively cancelled.

News Dots

Have you heard that the Canberra Racing Club is finalising initial redevelopment plans for Thoroughbred Park in Lyneham that could include three to six-storey apartment blocks, a commercial precinct, new stables and training facilities on the track infield and refreshed facilities for racegoers? The club says the long-term project would deliver 3200 dwellings on the light rail corridor, generate \$1 billion in economic activity and more than 2,000 jobs. It is preparing to take the plans, which are the product of several years' work, to community consultation in February.

For those new to Canberra, Thoroughbred Park is in Randwick Road, Lyneham – opposite and very close to the main entrance to EPIC (opposite end to the Dogs ACT office).

Haig Park in Canberra opened a new Farmers Market on Sun 7Feb21 and will open each Sunday from 8am to 2pm. There are approximately 40 stallholders at its start, there will be live music and dogs are welcome (on a leash).

Did you know that when the tennis stars and their teams were advised they had to do 14 days quarantine on their arrival in Australia they were given a chance to put in requests to make their lives easier during the quarantine. Several put in requests for either a kitten or a puppy to play with during those 14 days. Naturally, Tennis Australia refused.

The QT Hotel in Canberra now allows dogs into their rooms, IF they weight under 20kgs. Each has a bed, mini bar and in room dog's dinner menu. Seems Canberra is joining the other QR Hotels around Australia to do this, so if you want to take your dog with you on holiday, then this might be an option? The dogs must be well behaved and on a leash in common areas of the hotel; packages start at \$450, which includes a complimentary meal (for the dog!)

A basketball team in Miami is using sniffer dogs on their spectators in the hope that they can identify those people with Covid-19 symptoms before they get into the stadium. If the dog sits near a person, they are being asked to leave the area and get tested. In Australia there are currently 2 dogs in South Australia undergoing training run by the University in Adelaide.

If you are visiting Sydney with your dog, the newly opened Brooklyn Crispy at Potts Point is doing pizzas specifically for your canine member. While it's in the middle of an urban area it joins Café Bones in Leichhardt who also caters for dogs (they are next to a dog park).
