- Handlers must be residents of the ACT, or, residents of 'Approved Border Postcodes' as per <u>The</u> <u>ACT's Cross Border Travel Arrangements With NSW</u>
 - 2580, 2622, 2627, 2628, 2629, 2630, 2631, 2632, 2633, 2642, 2649, 2653, 2720, 2722, 2726, 2727, 2730
- Handlers, officials, and visitors must not have been in a COVID Hot Spot as identify by ACT Health and/or NSW Health in the 14 days prior to the date of the trial

TEMPORARY CHANGE TO ANKC AGILITY RULE REGARDING LEADS AND COLLARS

Current Rule:

7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. The lead and harness or head collar must be removed, the collar may be removed and all items handed to a Steward.

The temporary modified Rule:

'7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. The lead will be removed, the collar maybe removed. The Handler will either place the lead/collar in a pocket whilst running the course or wear it on them (e.g. clipped around their waist like a belt). If any of these items fall to the ground or the dog grabs the lead while running the course this will result in a DQ. The lead/collar must be inaudible and if not this will result in a DQ.'
