

FCI GENERAL ASSEMBLY, MADRID

JUNE 20-21, 2022

MAIN DECISIONS

On June 20-21, 2022, delegates from 75 FCI full member countries (present or represented) gathered in Madrid for the 2021 General Assembly (held in 2022 due to the covid-pandemic). It was organised by the Real Sociedad Canina de España (RSCE) in close collaboration with the FCI, at the HOTEL MELIÁ CASTILLA.

Various topics were discussed and some important decisions were made. We thank you for passing on this important information to your judges, breed clubs and all people involved in the dog scene in your country and to possibly reproduce them in your kennel gazette. Among the important decisions made, we would like to highlight:

BALANCE SHEETS, PROFIT AND LOSS ACCOUNTS, BUDGETS, FEES

The 2019, 2020 and 2021 financial accounts (Balance Sheets + Profit and Loss Accounts) were approved by the General Assembly.

The 2022 and 2023 budgets were also approved.

The fees remained unchanged. Please find them below:

ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE

- **T. JAKKEL (HU) – G. JIPPING (NL) – J.M. DOVAL (ES)** were elected for a 3-year term.

ELECTION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE MANDATORY COMMISSIONS

➤ *Standards Commission*

P. FRIEDRICH (DE) – C. GUINTARD (FR) – P.P. CONDO (IT) were elected for a 3-year term.

➤ *Scientific Commission*

V. CHRPOVA (CZ) – J.A. VILLALOBOS (MX) – A.E. VAZQUEZ LIEVANO (SV) were elected for a 3-year term.

OFFICIAL NOMINATION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE FCI FINANCIAL COMMISSION

E. DRUDI (SM) - F. AMORIM (BR) – R. NATIVIDAD (PH) were formally appointed by the FCI General Assembly, for a 1-year term.

NEW FULL MEMBERS

- **Georgia (Fédération Cynologique de Géorgie)** obtained the status of full member.
- **Montenegro (Kinoloski Savez Crne Gore - Kennel Club of Montenegro)** obtained the status of full member.

DEFINITIVE RECOGNITION OF BREEDS (FCI-CACIB AWARD)

One breed was recognized on a definitive basis and is now eligible for the FCI-CACIB and for the titles of FCI International Champion:

- **THAI BANGKAEW DOG (358) (Thailand)**

NEXT WORLD DOG SHOWS AND GENERAL ASSEMBLIES

The **2025 FCI General Assembly and World Dog Show (8-10/8/2025)** will be held in Helsinki (FI).

The **2026 FCI World Dog Show (4-7/6/2026)** will be held in Milan (IT).

The **2027 FCI General Assembly and World Dog Show (29/4 – 2/5/2027)** will be held in Wels (AT).

AMENDMENTS TO THE STATUTES AND STANDING ORDERS

- The amendments to the **FCI Standing Orders (new Art. 18.3 - Art. 20.3 - Art. 20.10)** were approved.
- The legal and other amendments to the **FCI Standing Orders/Internal Rules and FCI Statutes** were **officially** approved except for the **new Art. 17 (Standing Orders/Internal Rules)** and **Art. 25. q (Statutes)**.

- In August/September 2022, the FCI members will receive the final documents and will be asked to approve them by giving a proxy to the Belgian national canine organisation. With that collective proxy, a Belgian notary will then be able to officially register the new Statutes and Standing Orders/Internal Rules.
- A working group will be created by the General Committee to discuss specifically about Art.17 of the Standing Orders.

NEW NON-MANDATORY COMMISSION

The creation of one (1) new FCI non-mandatory commission was approved: **Commission for Water Dog Sport**

OTHER DECISIONS

- A fee of 2€/competitor taking part in FCI international Grooming competitions will be charged from September 1st, 2022.
- It was decided NOT to exclude RKF (Russia) and BCU (Belarus) from the FCI. However, the FCI General Committee will consider the possibility of depriving these organisations from all or part of their membership rights based on the complaint from UKU.
- The FCI General Committee was given permission to resume talks with the WUSV in order to settle the ongoing legal case opposing both WUSV (13 member clubs) and the FCI.
