The owner must live in the ACT and its region covered by post codes 2620, 2621, 2622, 2582 and 2581 and be a full or associate member of Dogs ACT.

Scoring:

Competition results from ANKC Agility trials conducted in the ACT, by affiliated clubs, from the 1st trial in September each year up to and including the last trial in August the year following will be used to determine entrants to the Dogs A.C.T Agility Dog of the Year competition.

The top seven (7) qualifying Trial results per dog from Agility classes (AD, ADX, ADM, ADE & ADO) will be counted.

Placings of qualifying results will be determined across all heights as one class (not separate heights) for each eligible trial. Scoring of the qualifying results will be as per the table below. Example, therefore seven (7) 1st places in ADM will achieve a score of seventy (70) points.

The course will be designed under the control of the Dogs ACT Agility Sub-Committee.

Prize:

The winner will receive a trophy and ribbon and will be named Dogs ACT Agility Dog of the Year.

Dogs A.C.T Jumping Dog of the Year



Entry eligibility:

Scoring:

The top seven (7) qualifying Trial results per dog from Jumping classes (JD, JDX, JDM, JDE and JDO) will be counted.

Placings of qualifying results will be determined across all heights as one class (not separate heights) for each eligible trial. Scoring of the qualifying results will be as per the table below. Example, therefore seven (7) 1st places in JDM will achieve a score of seventy (70) points.
