The Club reserves the right to make any changes that will ensure the smooth conduct of the trial, to substitute or appoint additional judges, to cap entry numbers, and to accept or reject entries.

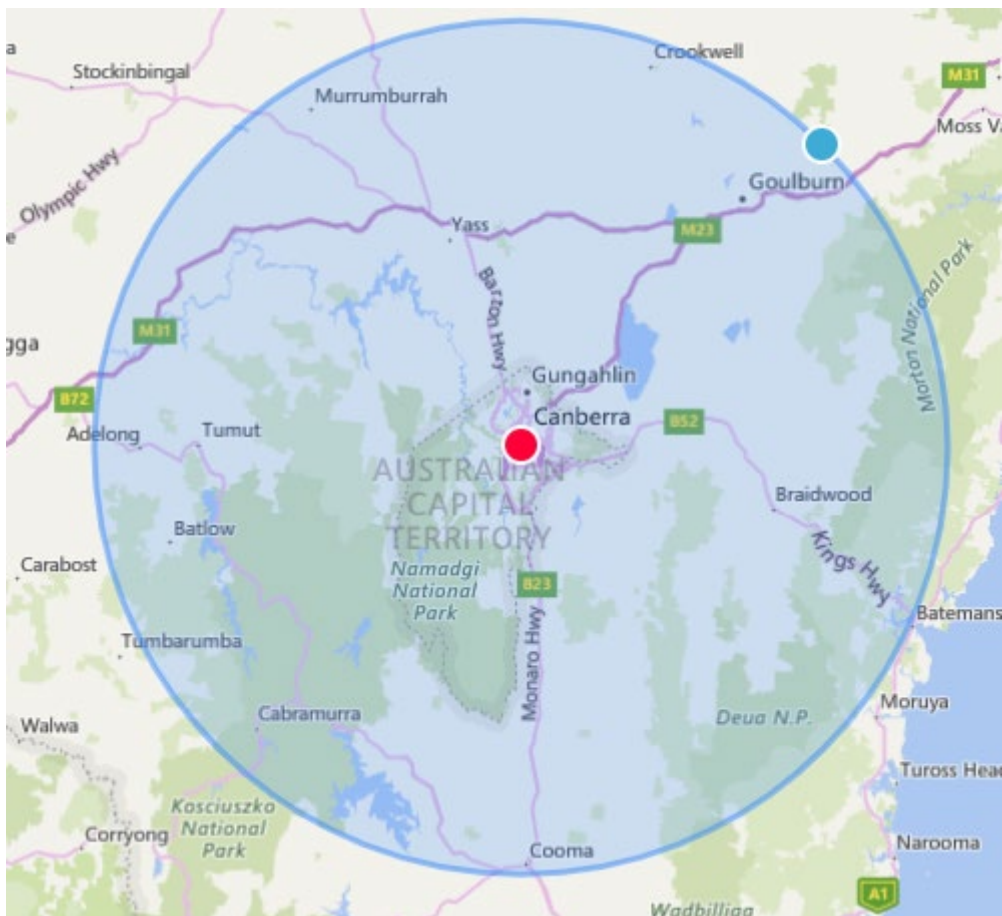
Entries will be decided by Ready Entries ballot. Any entries which are deemed to violate the fairness of the ballot process will be rejected by the club. Penalties for offending parties may include exclusion from future events.

Important Additional Information

- Entries limited to only two entries per person for the day. This restriction may be lifted if space permits
- All dogs will run in the first round. Dogs that do not complete the course will not be eligible to compete in the second round
- Exhibitors must bring their dog's height card or present their dog for measuring at check in
- Exhibitors must arrange their own second handlers
- All handlers must be financial members of their state member body. Handlers must be over 16 years of age
- Exhibitors should enter the name of their handler/helper when entering to aid with cataloguing
- Bitches in season are not allowed to compete or allowed on the club grounds
- Bitches must be a minimum of 10 weeks post whelp to compete. Mated bitches or bitches in whelp may not compete
- This trial may stop as per the rules, if the temperature reaches over 32°
- This trial is run under the rules and regulations of Dogs ACT

Entry Restrictions

The trial will be split into two groups based on your geographical location – Restricted and Open – with a total cap of 110 dogs. For the restricted trial, entries are restricted to people living within the area identified below (110km from Canberra City) plus anyone living in the south coast area from Batemans Bay to Eden (includes Cooma to Bega). The address provided in Ready Entries will be used to accept or reject entries.



Balloting Information

Entry into this trial will be via Ready Entries ballot. When the ballot is open for entry, you will need to create one ballot application per dog you'd like to enter (maximum of two ballot applications per Ready Entries account). There will be one ballot for the Restricted group and a second ballot for the Open group. Please only enter one ballot. Anyone who enters both ballots will have all applications rejected.

How Do I Enter The Ballot?

- Go to the **View Event Group** page for this event
- Click the **APPLY FOR BALLOT** button to show the **Apply for Event Ballot** section
- Scroll down to the correct event (Restricted or Open)
- Select the class (100m)
- Click the **SUBMIT BALLOT APPLICATION** button
- If you wish to submit a second application, click the **SUBMIT ANOTHER** button and repeat the above process

How Do I Know I've Entered The Ballot?

After you submit your application, you will see a little prompt telling you that you have submitted your application. If you return to the **Apply for Event Ballot** section later, it will show you a list of your ballot applications for the event.

Ready Entries will send you an email confirming that you have submitted a ballot application. You can also check your ballot applications on your **My Entries** (<https://readyentries.com/my-entries>) page.

If you have entered the wrong ballot, or accidentally entered both ballots, you can remove your ballot application via the **Apply for Event Ballot** section or your **My Entries** page.

And I Can Only Enter One Ballot?

Yes. Please minimise the administrative load for the trial manager and only enter one ballot. If you live within the restricted area, enter only the Restricted ballot. If you live outside the restricted area, enter only the Open ballot. The ballots will be compared before either is drawn, and anyone who has entered both will be removed from both.

The ballots will be biased towards those living in the restricted area. The Restricted ballot will be drawn first, and all unsuccessful Restricted applications will be added to the Open ballot before it is drawn.

How Do I Enter?

When the ballot is run, if you're successful then you'll receive an email from Ready Entries telling you that you can now enter the event. You'll have to go to the View Event Group page and click the **ACCEPT BALLOT INVITE** button to access the entry screen.

What's the Timeline?

- **Friday 20th March:** the ballot will be closed, and the first group of ballot winners will be drawn for both groups. Successful applicants will need to enter before **9:00am on Friday 27th March**. Any ballot winners who do not enter by the deadline will not be returned to the ballot pool for the second draw and will have any additional ballot applications cancelled
- **Friday 27th March:** if there are available spaces, the ballots will be drawn for a second and final time. Successful applicants will need to enter before **9:00am on Monday 30th March**
- **Monday 30th March:** entries close, no further invitations will be offered, and no refunds or changes will be accepted
