Not for Competition (NFC) entries will be accepted for CCD, Novice and Open. Competition entries will be given priority over NFC entries. NFC dogs may be entered into the class they are eligible or a lower class, and may not also be entered as a competition entry in the same trial. NFC entry allows the use of a non-audible toy or food rewards. Food rewards must be stored inside a sealed container which must be left on the designated reward table, and may only be given to the dog at the reward table. The reward table will be located on the outside of the ring, and must be at least 6m from another ring. Full NFC rules will be available closer to the trial date.

The Club reserves the right to make any changes that will ensure the smooth conduct of the trial, to substitute or appoint additional judges, to cap entry numbers, and to accept or reject entries. Dogs ACT Regulations allow contracted judges to compete in the trials provided they do not do so in the classes they have been contracted to judge.
